Some of the items presented are as follows:

This past year the Pioneer Organization received two Grants, the grants were split between the current 17 Chapter. AGB portion of the money was put to good use by giving back to our local communities. The following articles describes the project. Respectfully submitted by: Susan Shaw

#1 For a portion of the 2017 PCFG Grant, Alexander Graham Bell Chapter 15 looked to assist in the area of education-specifically Fairfax County Public Schools in Northern Virginia. FCPS system is the 10th largest in the U.S., serving more than 188,000 students in grades prekindergarten through 12. FCPS supports a wonderfully diverse student population but more than 52,000 (28%) of those students are eligible for free and reduced-price meals; more than 28,000 (17 %) receive English for speakers of other languages (ESOL) services, and more than 25,000 (13%) receive special education services. When we reached out to Sherry Noud of FCPS and asked how we might be able to help, she cited their greatest need was backpacks. Fortunately, one of AGB's yearly chapter projects is providing backpacks to our serving area, so our Nancy Rebar already had an account with a vendor at low rates. Spending

\$1,814.40, we gladly responded by shipping to their warehouse 18 boxes, a total of 432 backpacks. Sherry invited us to join her at their warehouse on August 23rd for distribution day. We saw and met

school staff coming to the warehouse to pick up the backpacks we purchased as well as numerous other supplies. The timing of our help could not have been better as a couple of organizations that FCPS had counted on in the past were unable to help this year. Our group's donation of 432 backpacks was the largest. The backpacks were well received and appreciated! Deliveries were completed by 8/7/17.



#2 For a portion of the 2017 PCFG Grant, Alexander Graham Bell Chapter 15 looked to assist in the area of human services. Specifically, St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth, and Families. St. Ann's is located in Hyattsville, MD and supports Maryland's and Washington DC's most vulnerable youth. They are a 157-year-old organization committed to lifting children, mother's and families out of poverty and homelessness. Their multi-faceted housing and support programs provide the tools for life-long independence. Their Teen Mother Baby Program, Supportive & Transitional Housing Program, Clinical and Social Work Services, Education & Employment Program, and Child Care Center are at the core of St Ann's life-saving mission. They currently support 26 mothers and 31 children ages 1 wk to 10 yrs old. The average stay for a family is 2 years. AGB has supported St. Ann's for many years so when we reached out to Sister Mary Bader to ask how we could further help, she gratefully told us that with the growing number of families in their Hope House Program, they were most in need of a refrigerator freezer. The families in this residential program purchase their own food and make their own meals. Lucky for all, this happened around a holiday weekend with great sales on appliances! We found one that fit their needs including free delivery and setup! Delivery was completed on Sept 8th. Sister Mary arranged a visit for

us on Oct 6th where we brought additional items including 2 rugs, a book, diapers and many food items (Dish It Up). Sister Mary spoke in length about their mission and challenges. She also gave us a tour of the facilities, so we could see how our help makes a difference.

#3 For this project, we selected to purchase pajamas and books to provide to children living in safe houses and shelters within the Northern Virginia community. We reached out to Karen Duffy, Local President of "Pajama Program" to help identify where the needs were the greatest and to help with contacts and coordinate delivery. Karen is a strong advocate for the safe and caring feelings a child experiences when given a new set of pajamas and a book. She was excited to help. With the grant money, we purchased 152 sets of pajamas and matched these with scholastic books which we already had on hand. Sizes ranged from 9 mos-17yrs. Each set of pajamas was paired with a book to match and bound together with soft yarn of warm colors. We made deliveries to four locations in Northern Virginia. One location in Manassas, one location in Fairfax, one in Falls Church and one in Annandale. All the pajamas and books were well

received and appreciated! Deliveries completed by 7/26/17.



Backpack Project- 2017- August, 2017 - Backpack ProjectOnce again members from the Chapter came together to put together 100 Backpacks for our local schools filed with school supplies such as; pencils, glue sticks, notebooks, erasers, pens,

rulers, tissues, highlighters, crayons, pocket folders and student dictionaries.
